

Middlefield Dog Park

The Town of Middlefield is pleased to announce that the Middlefield Dog Park is officially open. The Middlefield Dog Owner's Group, in conjunction with Tyler Sibley, a Middlefield Boy Scout with an ambitious Eagle Scout project and the Middlefield Conservation Commission, have joined forces to raise the funds and supply the volunteer labor necessary to construct a beautiful, new dog park in Middlefield.

The park is located on the beautiful 75 acre open space parcel known as The King Property, nestled on Beseck Mountain. It offers an opportunity for dogs to safely run leash-free, and owners to socialize with other dog owners. The park consists of approximately one acre of woodland, enclosed with a continuous 5' tall chain link fence. There are separate fenced areas for both large and small (or timid) dogs.

To get there from Rte 66 (691), turn onto Rte 147 south at Guida's hot dog stand. One mile on 147 make a right onto Lake Road at the Lakeside Market (Gulf gas station). Lake road turns into Algonquin Road as you start to climb the hill. At the stopsign make a left onto Mattabeseck Road and follow it almost to the end. The parking area is inside the metal gates just past the Roman statues. After parking, follow the yellow trail, bearing left at the trail merge.

Unlike most dog parks, the Middlefield Dog Park is a carry-in, carry-out park. Please bring your own doggie bag with you, pick up whatever your pup deposits, and carry out the waste when you leave. The Middlefield Dog Park is maintained 100% by volunteers.
